THE DANISH APPROACH TO ENGLISH LANGUAGE TEACHING

We use and think of language as a means of communication. This is obvious when pupils are taught in their native language, and in a language homogenous country like Denmark, where 92-93% of the population have Danish as their mother tongue, that means almost all the time.

However, when we teach foreign languages, it is not uncommon that the communicative aspects give way to learning language structure and grammar. We want the pupils to be able to speak correctly before they start communicating. However in recent years a shift has been made towards a more communicative and functional approach to language teaching in Denmark. This and more will be addressed at this webinar.

THE LEXILE FRAMEWORK IN THE EFL CLASSROOM

The Lexile® measures are the de facto standards for matching students with leveled materials in the U.S. and internationally. The Lexile Frameworks have been widely adopted to assess students' language abilities, to gauge the complexity of instructional and assessment materials, and to evaluate the match between student abilities and difficulty of materials.

In this webinar, I will introduce the Lexile Frameworks and their theoretical underpinnings. I will also demonstrate how Lexile tools can be used for classroom instruction and materials development, and for tackling common challenges in the EFL classrooms.

FLIPPING THE CLASSROOM, THE FINNISH WAY

In Pontus school in Lappeenranta, Finland, architecture, among other things, sets guidelines to how we study and teach. Open space and no home classrooms is an everyday fact we have to deal with. To make the most of our environment we use material and methods from various sources.

We use: - Montessori material and Montessori type teaching methods where students work together and also in mixed age groups. - Flipped learning so the students study subjects on their own and practice at school. - Mindset by Carol Dweck. How we try to strengthen a student's own ability to gain control of one's own learning and how to master it. - Working in teams. - Our own inventions: Popsis achievement booklet, green card.

DEVELOPMENT OF SPEAKING AND WRITING SKILLS IN YOUNG LEARNERS

In this webinar, we will share findings from a multi-year Erasmus Plus grant project in which we investigated the speaking and writing development of approximately 500 young students who learn EFL in primary and secondary-level schools in the Netherlands, Finland, and Denmark.

We administered different speaking and writing tasks to the students and evaluated their responses using holistic and analytic scoring techniques as well as automated text and speech analysis tools to identify response characteristics.

We will present how features such as fluency, vocabulary use, and grammar) develop across proficiency levels and how these features are associated with learners' backgrounds such as grade level and first language.

Finally, we will discuss the findings relative to their implications for English language teaching and assessment.
